

# State Baseball Team Defeats Tiger Nine

A Lyon at Oxy but just a Cub to San Diego was in evidence as the Aztec baseball team upset, trotted on, and walloped Occidental 14 to 3, at Golden Hill last Saturday, pounding Lyons, Stellar Tiger mound artist, for 11 hits.

All "Jumbo" Churchman showed plenty of ability by letting the tigers down with only 9 hits, while 11 bit the dust via the strikeout route. Lyons allowed 11 hits also striking out 11, but numerous errors by his infielders helped make Dads' Day a success.

"Buzz" Pastes Ball  
"Buzz" Smyth, all conference end and leadoff man showed little regard for Lyons' reputation by pasting the first Tiger pitch against the right field fence for a single. "Tempermental" Burne helped the cause by also singling and a sprinkling of errors allowed both to score and the San Diego team was on its way.

In the fourth Hopkins, who turned in a stellar catching performance, welcomed the rival chucker with a sharp single; then the big parade started with the entire team taking a trip to the plate, with Hopkins, Churchman, Garboni, and Burne scoring.

Oxy Fails To Hit  
Occidental couldn't seem to hit the State "Jumbo" effectively and trailed 9 to 1 at the end of the fourth.

A bad case of dropsy enabled two more Aztec runs to swell the score in the fifth, with Smyth and Garboni scoring.

A belated rally in the seventh enabled the now tame Tigers to score. Baker reached first on an error, and scored when Cosby hit. Lyon came through with a double putting Cosby on third. Here "Jumbo" Churchman settled down and whiffed the next batter.

Smyth Walks  
Smyth walked to start the seventh, Burne flew out, Garboni was hit by a pitched ball, Larson doubled scoring Smyth and Garboni, while Higashi sacrificed to score Larson for the final Aztec run.

# WRESTLERS PLACE THIRD IN TOURNEY

Led by Suke Alzumi, who nabbed second place in the 126 lb. class, San Diego State college's newly formed wrestling team carried the colors of the Black and Red into the county A. A. U. grappling meet for the first time and came out of the melee with a tie for third place in the team championship race.

After dropping a close decision to Manuel Moreno, runner up in the recent junior nationals, Alzumi came back a short time later to pin Harry Hottenstein of San Diego high and gain second place laurels.

Swab Places Third  
Another State college entry, Gus Swab, went to the finals in the 118 lb. class but was defeated by Vic Negrette and Gilbert Sour of the high school and had to be content with third place. George Saleeby, Aztec 112 pounder, will wrestle Ben Kimmel, hilltop entry, sometime this week to determine the runner up position in the flyweight class. Through an error by the officials Kimmel was forced to wrestle someone who was to have been Saleeby's opponent.

Match Is Postponed  
In all fairness to Kimmel, Saleeby agreed to have the match postponed until sometime this week.

Three Montezuma entries, Doc Marrow, Dick Farwell, and Guy Moore, had opportunities to wrestle for second and third places but they had to default because they had dates for the evening.

High Keeps Title  
San Diego high retained its team title by scoring 26 points, followed by the Army and Navy "Y" with 21, San Diego State and City "Y" with 13, and the San Diego club who had 8 digits.

Selwyn Hartigan ran a sixty-yard flight of high hurdles in 7.5 seconds early this season. Until about six weeks ago, this was the world's record, when the mark was lowered to 7.4.

# Aztec Trackmen Whip Redlands Cinder Team

Overwhelming the Redland Bulldogs, 75 to 56, Saturday on the plains of Montezuma, the San Diego State Aztec spike artists swept the high barriers, the 440 and half-mile runs.

The best individual performances of the day were turned in by Johnson and Case of Redlands. The former garnered 14 digits in weight events while his speedy teammate turned in a 9:09 hundred and a 22.1 twenty—which is good in any league.

Viau and Heryet amused the crowd by loafing—discussing various and sundry topics as they ran—the two-mile and finishing together.

The Aztecs amassed eight first places as against six for their visitors with the high jump split between Kendall and McPhie of San Diego and Crawford, Redlands.

At no time of the meet did the future look bleak for the famed



Indians, who only found tough going in the weight events.

The biggest disappointment of the day was Pierson's and "Tiger" Lees faltering efforts in the javelin.

The smooth-cleeking mile relay squad surprised the fans by winning the event in 3:31.

Captain "Cy" Hartigan copped the highs and took second to Day in the lows, while McPhie won the broad jump, tied McMichael for third in the pole vault, and tied for first place in the high jump.

Kenney Ray has shown the most improvement to date—by running a close second to Case

in both sprints. His time for the 100 yard dash was 10 flat.
